Official Food Vendor Rules for A Renaissance in Roanoke

- 1. A Renaissance in Roanoke is sponsored by The Roanoke Beautification Foundation Arts Council, Joseph Decuis, and other local sponsors.
- 2. Vendor agrees to exercise the utmost care in the use of facilities and properties of *A Renaissance in Roanoke* and the town of Roanoke. The Vendor also agrees to indemnify and to hold harmless the town of Roanoke, Roanoke Businessman's Association (Chamber), and The RBF Arts Council, it's officers, employees, and agents from any and all claims, actions, judgments, losses, costs, (including reasonable attorney fees), and damages whatsoever; including claims arising by reason of accident, injury, or death caused to persons or property of any kind, arising out of, in connection with or incidental to *A Renaissance in Roanoke*, except caused by the sole negligence of *A Renaissance in Roanoke*, and the town of Roanoke.
- 3. Vendors shall be liable for delivery, handling, erection, and removal of his/her own equipment.
- 4. Insurance, if desired by the Vendor, must be obtained by the Vendor at the Vendor's own expense. The Arts Council assumes no risk and, by acceptance of this agreement, the Vendor expressly releases The Arts Council and the town of Roanoke and all of its representatives of and from any and all liability for any damage, injury, or loss to any person or goods which may arise from the Festival and the Vendor, and agrees to hold and save The Arts Council and it's representatives harmless of any loss or damage by reason thereof.
- 5. The Arts Council will not be liable for refunds or any other liabilities whatsoever for the failure to fulfill this contract due to acts of God, public enemy, strikes, statutes, ordinances, or any legal authority, or any other cause beyond the Festival Committee's control.
- 6. All pertinent fire codes, laws, ordinances, and regulations pertaining to health, fire prevention, and public safety shall be strictly obeyed. Nothing shall be nailed, stapled, taped, or otherwise fixed to any community or private property.
- 7. Exhibitor will be required to have any and all business licenses, permits, and requisite insurance that are needed for his/her operation. Vendor is responsible for legal sales and collection of proper sales tax on any products sold at the Festival.
- 8. Entertainer agrees to allow the Festival Committee to use their images for promotional purposes.
- 9. This contract constitutes the entire contract between parties and no waivers, modifications, or amendments shall be valid unless written upon or attached hereto, and shall be approved in writing by The Arts Council.
